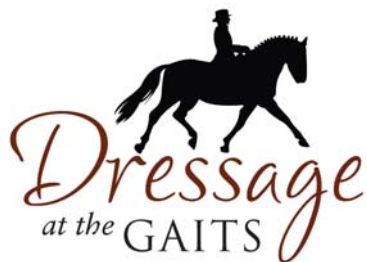

Class 269: Exhibition Freestyle Costume Jackpot Class (Class Fee \$65.00)

Class is a Test of Choice USDF or FEI Freestyle Class.

Awards will be given based on test score, with consideration given to costume's contribution to the overall artistic impressions. Awards presentation will be held immediately after the completion of the class. Entrants are required to participate in the awards presentation, but are not required to be mounted. \$10 of each entry will go into the jackpot. The 1st Place winner receives the jackpot. Award is based on the number of entrants. (Competitor needs to be eligible to show the Freestyle level that they are entering and provide proof of eligibility per USEF rules. Scores do not count towards CDS, USDF or USEF awards or scores, nor do scores count toward Dressage at the Gaits High Point awards per USEF rules.)

NDPC Series Awards: The awards will be broken down into the following divisions: Open, AA, Jr/YR. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in each division. The weighted scores will then be averaged to calculate the winners. You must show in at least four Pony Only TOC classes (freestyle classes are not eligible).

NDPC Freestyle Series Awards: The awards will be broken down into the following divisions: Open, AA, Jr/YR. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in each division. The weighted scores will then be averaged to calculate the winners. Freestyles will use the highest degree of difficulty at each level. You must show in at least four Pony Only Freestyle classes to be eligible for these awards.

NDPC Year-End Awards: All tests and freestyles ridden in Pony Classes will automatically be entered in NDPC Year-End Awards.

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS & EXCEPTIONS

All Dressage at the Gaits shows are recognized by USEF, USDF and CDS. To participate, the horse MUST have a USDF Horse Identification Number (HID) (unless competing in Opportunity classes.) If the horse does not have a USDF HID number, please add \$25 HID fee to entry. You can upgrade the registration at the show to Annual or Lifetime if desired. Rider, Owner and Trainer must be a member of USEF or pay a \$30 Show Pass fee. Rider and Owner must be a member of USDF or pay the non-member fee of \$25. (Opportunity, Introductory classes are exempt from all membership requirements.)

Eligibility to ride a USDF Regional Championship Qualifying test requires that the Rider and Owner are Active USEF members, Rider is PARTICIPATING and Owner is PARTICIPATING or BUSINESS members of USDF. Horse must be USDF Lifetime registered, and USEF Lifetime or Annual registered. These memberships must be in place at the time the scores are earned. The \$10 fee for the Qualifying ride must be paid in advance of the ride.

SHOW RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

1. ENTRY ACCEPTANCE:

- All entries must be **postmarked or time stamped** by the closing date. The show management may close entries early if the show is full.
- Entries must be filled out completely and have proper fees enclosed. Federation Agreement Page must be signed by rider, owner, trainer, and coach. *Minors (riders under 18 years old) must have the parent or guardian sign the Federation Agreement. ***Missing signature pages-even for online entries are considered incomplete and subject to \$10 incomplete fee.***
- Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. This show accepts mailed, faxed and electronic online entries. **No Phoned Entries.** Mailed entries are accepted based on the post mark date, and are only accepted on or after the opening date listed in the prize list. Online entries are accepted based on the date/time stamp of the paid submission. Should the show be over subscribed and the need to cut off entries prior to the closing date arise, entries received after the show fills will be notified and be given the option to be placed on a wait list or receive a full refund. Ties regarding entries received at any time on the same day/time will be broken by lot in the show secretary's office prior to scheduling the show. Affected competitors will be notified and allowed to be present when the drawing of lot is performed. (Secretary's office is not at the show grounds.)
- Incorrect or incomplete entries may be charged \$10 per correction and/or may not be accepted.
- No numbers will be issued without completed entries, full payment, signatures, fees and CURRENT copies of ALL registration cards. Always bring your cards to the show with you.

2. SCRATCHES, CHANGES and CANCELLATIONS:

It is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the show secretary (510) 672-3260 of intention to scratch. Refunds are given for scratches prior to closing date, less the office fee. No refunds given after closing date without vet certificate, and only if ride can be filled from wait list with same class, and will also be less the office fee. Refund of USDF Qualifying Fees: Scratches prior to show in which a full refund (less office fee) is being made WILL include any USDF Qualifying fee paid. Scratches that do NOT qualify for a full refund will NOT be refunded any USDF Qualifying fees. Non-refunded USDF Qualifying Fees will be paid to USDF per USDF rules. Changes to Entries: changes made after the closing date will be assessed a \$10 fee. Cancellations: Shows will be held rain or shine. No refunds given due to weather conditions

3. ENTRY CONFIRMATIONS:

Entry confirmations will be emailed. Please ensure that your email is set to allow emails from **confirmations@foxvillage.com**. Competitors are responsible for reading and responding to the entry confirmation. If entry confirmation is not received by the closing date of the show, the competitor is advised to contact the show secretary.

4. RIDE TIMES:

Ride times will be emailed as well as posted on the Harlequin Show Experience website: **www.harlequinshowexperience.com** and the Fox Village website: **www.foxvillage.com** prior to the start of the show. It is the rider's responsibility to inform management if times are not received. Competitors should be prepared to be scheduled at any time, as it may be necessary to run classes out of order.

5. STABLING:

Stabled horses must provide proof of Vaccination per GR845 with entry. Permanent 12 x16 stalls with sliding doors, or permanent 12x10 solid wall stalls with gate doors. Both have mat floors. See fee list for rates. Stalls assigned on first-come-first-served basis. Groups may be split if one stall type sells out before all entries received. Stalls do not have automatic water. Competitors must bring water buckets or tubs for horses. **DO NOT** dump water in stalls. Water must be dumped in the wash rack or outside of the barns. Dumping water buckets in the stalls causes additional clean up for the facility staff and will result in charges to the entrant. Manure dumping stations will be located at the back side of the show barn. Shavings available at \$11/bale. Outside shavings require a \$30 per horse disposal fee.

6. **FREESTYLES:** Freestyle entries must send a copy of eligibility test with entry. Freestyle music must be on compact disk. Please give CD to Show Secretary upon check-in on show day. Sound check will be held daily at the first break, approximately 10 AM each day.
7. **MANAGEMENT:** The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and that decision will be final. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and to cancel or award prizes, without claim to damage, to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or substitute officials. The judges' decisions are strictly their own and the Management accepts absolutely no responsibility for those decisions. Management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges and to cancel, combine or amend any class, including but not limited to class awards, scheduling and location.
8. **NON-COMPETE HORSES:** Horses not competing in the show must be registered with the show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times when out of the stall. Entry form and signed Federation Agreement must be submitted, and appropriate fees must be paid prior to the horse being ridden. Failure to register and pay for schooling horse can result in doubling of entry fee. Non-compete horses are allowed in the warm-up as long as there is room and their presence is not disruptive. This determination will be made solely at the discretion of show management. There may be other areas on the grounds available for schooling purposes. No schooling of horses in or around the competition arenas during the competition. After the completion of the competition, with permission of show management, competition arenas may be opened for schooling.
9. **PONY MEASUREMENT CARDS:** Competitors wishing to have their scores count for pony awards must include a current pony measurement card with their entry, or arrange to have pony measured at the show. If competitor wants to have their pony measured by the TD at the show, they must let management know two weeks in advance of show date. Vet will be on site to do pony measurements on the Friday of each show at 1:00PM for those competitors that have made appointments with show management. Competitor will be responsible for paying vet call fees and other fees associated with having pony measurement completed. If Vet is called away due to emergency, the show can not be held responsible, but will work to arrange an alternate time for measurements during the show.
10. **RESTROOM FACILITIES:** The show provides many Port-O-Potties for the show. Gilroy Gaits requests that participants of the show and their guests kindly use the temporary facilities brought in for the show and refrain from using the on-site restrooms in the main office and vet offices. Your understanding is appreciated.
11. **AWARDS:** Ribbons through 5th place. Highpoint awards to Open, Adult Amateur, and Jr/YR for each show, Award Ceremony for Show Highpoint at end of day on Saturday. Series Highpoint prizes awarded for Open, Adult Amateur, and Jr/YR awarded to highest scoring individual that showed in at least two of the three shows. Honor rounds required for those competing in Jackpot and Stakes classes to receive awards.
12. **FOOD:** Food available on the grounds for purchase one hour before show to end of show day.
13. **LUNGING:** Absolutely no lunging in the warm up arena. Lunging allowed in designated competition lunging areas only. Round pens and lunge areas will be signed. Please limit time in lunge arenas when others are waiting.
14. **ARENAS and FOOTING:** Show arenas are indoors and out doors and are standard regulation size (20m x 60m). Overall dimensions are approximately 150' X 300', and have Euro Sand footing. Warm up arenas are outdoors with similar footing.
15. **VET & FARRIER:** Peninsula Equine Hospital is onsite and will provide on call vet service. Phone numbers will be posted at the show office for both vet and farriers.
16. **EMT:** Qualified medical personnel are on the premises at all horse shows.
17. **DOGS:** Preferable that dogs stay at home; any dog on the property must be on held leash at all times. 2011 GR1301.6 USEF Rules apply. Please review.
18. **PARKING:** Competitors must park in designated areas. No car or trailer parking in the center barn parking lot. (AKA "The Village")

RULES:

SHARPS CONTAINERS: GR1210.4 Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. **Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.** Competition management will place a notice of this requirement either in its prize list or on a specific handout given to trainers on check in at the competition. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail. Competitions failing to comply with placing the required number of containers on the show grounds will be considered in violation of the rules and may be subject to penalty as determined by the CEO or Executive Director and/or the Hearing Committee.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

RULES, continued:

DR120 Dress:

WAIVING OF COATS: In locations with high average heat and humidity on the date of a competition, management can publish in their prize list that jackets will be waived for the duration of the competition. Alternatively, management can announce prior to or during a competition that competitors can show without jackets when extreme heat and/or humidity is forecast. This waiver applies to in all classes including FEI classes at National Competitions. However, competitors must wear protective headgear and a shirt with sleeves and collar, without neckwear, and without decoration except as described under **.14 below**. T-shirts are not permitted. Members of the Armed Services or police units may wear summer uniforms.

HELMET RULE EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2013: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat covers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120 (see GR801).

USPRE High Point Program

This program is designed to encourage PRE riders of all levels to train and compete in rated dressage shows. The USPRE High Point award is available at any USDF dressage show around the country when organized by members. Currently, the program has developed series in two locations: Florida and California. The schedule of shows where USPRE High Points are awarded is posted below. Grand Champions of the series' are awarded a USPRE riding jacket.

At each program show, USPRE will pin the following High Point winners:

Please note the following directives for the USPRE High Point Program:

All contestants (rider or horse owner) must be USPRE members in good standing. Three Grand Champions (National Level, FEI Level and Youth Rider) will be named following the end of each respective series (California and Florida). There will be no distinction made for CDI or Open/AA in determining Grand Champions. Grand Champions will be determined by the sum of their three highest scores at the same level, from two separate shows. Contestants may participate in more than two shows to obtain their three highest scores for submission. Scores may be submitted only from the highest level at which the horse has competed with the current rider. FEI level is reserved for adult riders. Youth Riders have their own category. Scores must be a minimum of 62% to qualify for a High Point award. Freestyle scores do not apply.

2017 USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program

The USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program is designed to specifically recognize and encourage adult amateurs riding at Second Level.

Awards

1. Medal Recipient

The eligible rider with the highest score of 60 percent or better in the designated Second Level Test Three class or applicable test of choice USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal class at a participating competition will receive a medal and neck ribbon. Winners will receive a gift certificate for the first three medals they win during the competition season.

2. National Merit Award

A National Merit Award will be awarded to riders winning three medals in the same competition year.

3. Year-End Awards

The National Champion and Reserve Champion are determined from the average of the top three winning ride scores during the competition year. The champion and reserve champion will receive a gift certificate.

Rider Eligibility

1. Rider must have a current USDF Participating or Group Membership and be a member in good standing of USDF when the scores are earned.
2. Rider must be an adult amateur in accordance with Article GR1306 of the USEF rules and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur at the time the scores are earned.

Owner & Horse Eligibility

1. Horse and owner must meet minimum competition eligibility requirements at the time scores are earned.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

CDS MEMBERSHIP

CDS Membership is not required to participate in USEF/USDF recognized shows.

However, if your goal is to qualify for the CDS Annual Championship show, CDS Junior Championships (North or South), or CDS Adult Amateur Competitions (North, Central or South), or any CDS awards programs, the Rider and owner must be members of CDS at the time the scores are earned. Proof of CDS membership is required with entry for scores to count. Those that do not provide valid CDS membership numbers and cards with their entry are required to fill out a CDS non-member form at the show.

To ensure that your scores count for CDS Championships and other CDS events, be sure to include a copy of your card with your entry, or join at the show.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.) Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$75), 5-years (\$300), or life (\$1,500). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$60). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$200) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (EM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$25 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$25). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$70. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$95) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.
