Important USEF Membership & Horse Registration Requirements

Coaches and Trainers MUST be USEF members at time of entry submission. Non-member riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, lungers, owners, lessees, and agents are allowed ONE (1) Show Pass per competition YEAR, which must be applied for and paid online to USEF PRIOR TO SHOW.

As of December 2023, ALL HORSES MUST HAVE A USEF HORSE ID at the time of entry. Please register your horse online with USEF and provide your horse's USEF ID or Registration number and card with your entry. Entries missing this information will be rejected.

Entries that do not include active USEF member numbers for ALL persons listed on the entry will be rejected. If you have a person that will be coaching you at the competition, they MUST be listed on the entry as "Coach", with USEF member number and MUST sign the USEF Entry Agreement form.

*Note- this show offers "Opportunity" classes that may help if you have not renewed memberships or registered horse as needed. *

Important Information Regarding Entry Submission

Please read this section carefully

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

Please make sure that your entry includes the following documents:

1. Federation Agreement Signature page (2024) with signatures for Rider, Owner, Trainer, Coach and Parent as applicable. (Rider, Owner & Trainer REQUIRED, Coach must sign if attending show.) PDF preferred.
2. Federation Waiver and Release of Liability form (2024) with signatures for Rider, Owner, Trainer, Coach and Parent as applicable. (Rider, Owner & Trainer REQUIRED, Coach must sign if attending show.) PDF preferred.
3. Vaccination records for horse. (Flu/Rhino) Vaccinations need to be within past 6 months, and at least 7 days prior the show. Vaccination records must list horse's **competition name** and must match name on the entry form. **EACH** entry must have a vaccination form attached. PDF preferred.

Please make sure that your entry has the CORRECT information and includes membership and horse recording numbers and CARDS

1. Use CORRECT information for all people and horses on the entry. Do NOT use YOUR information in for Owner, Trainer or Coach if these are different people than you. Each person needs their own unique and correct data. BAD DATA (address, phone, email or membership numbers) creates BAD entries and will cause additional fees.
2. Membership and Horse Recording numbers and **CARDS** are required for all classes that require membership. Horse MUST have a USDF AND USEF horse recording number for any class other than Intro & Opportunity. (**NOTE**—if you have correct numbers on your Fox Village Entry, you **DO NOT need to upload cards**—Cards are automatically attached to your entry if the profile information is correct.) USEF memberships and horse recordings must be done online at USEF website prior to entering the show.
3. Emergency contact and phone for ANYONE that will be mounted while on show grounds must be on the entry. (May put on signature forms as needed.)

Other things that help us to keep fees low:

- We kindly request that you create your entry online at FoxVillage Entries. If mailing a paper entry, please include the \$10 mailing fee.
- Memberships and registrations MUST be active and up to date **at the time of entry**. USDF non-members will be charged a non-member fee if membership is not active at time of entry. USDF Non-member fees are NOT refundable. All fees collected are paid to USDF as required. Please renew your memberships at least 7 days prior to creating your entry.
- **Print and check your online entry before you submit**. Make sure you have ATTACHED the Federation Agreement and Waiver and horse vaccination documents. Verify that it is the correct form and signatures match people listed on the entry.
- Signatures on Federation Agreement and Waivers must be either a script (wet) signature OR an e-sig with a certificate number. A typed name on the "signature" line is not legal and will not be accepted.
- **DO NOT** include any of the following with your entry; Safe Sport Certificate, Freestyle records, Pony measurement, Facility releases other than **Yarra Yarra**, or out of date vaccination records.
- Incomplete entries, inaccurate (bad data) entries or those missing documents will be charged \$25 fee. Please note, this helps us keep the office fees down for those that do submit complete entries.

NEED HELP?

Several sources are available if you need help with your entry.

- Harlequinshowexperience.com—has many links and info to help you including; signature forms, links to USEF, USDF and CDS.
- The Entry Secretary is here to help. If you need tutorial help with Fox Village entries or other entry related issues, you can set an appointment for a Zoom meeting or call. Entry instruction offered at \$15/half hour or \$25/hour. Get help to ensure your entry is correct prior to submission to avoid incomplete entry fees. Email appointment request with times/days you are available to LDSon-Horse@gmail.com.

YARRA YARRA has consistently worked to keep entry fees as reasonable as possible:

- We DO NOT charge any "COVID 19" fees.
- We DO NOT charge any "EMT" fees.
- We DO NOT use fancy expensive scoring programs. We LOVE Fox Village and our scores are posted online to Fox Village and Competitor Tent in REAL TIME. Scores are normally posted with in 15 minutes of the completion of the ride. For movement by movement scores, use the Competitor Tent app.

We appreciate your support of our shows and hope that by keeping the show fees reasonable you are able to come show with us frequently this year.

More Important Information ...

COVID-19 Action Plan

As long as US Equestrian Federation requires competitions to follow a COVID protocol, this show will implement a “COVID-19 Action Plan”. The plan includes protocol that USEF has directed shows to implement, as well as other precautions show management is implementing to help mitigate the spread of disease. Your entry and participation in this show are predicated on your agreement to follow and abide by the protocols as outlined and provided by show management. Protocols and guidelines are subject to change. The most recent requirements will be emailed prior to each competition and posted on the show grounds.

GENERAL COVID PROTOCOL:

To mitigate the spread of COVID or other communicable disease includes, the show protocol includes, but is not limited to the following:

- Prior to the show, please check your entry confirmation and provide any items needed to complete entry. Entry must be COMPLETE prior to arrival at competition.
- Number packets will be on a table outside of office. Please send one designated person to pick up group packets if possible. (Subject to change based on EHV1 requirements.) *New Rule 2024: EVERY COMPETITOR MUST CHECK IN. You can send someone to check in for you, but you must check in with the office.
- Social Distancing—Please maintain 6 feet of distance between people where possible, particularly with those not in your immediate group.
- Ride times will be posted to FoxVillage by noon prior to the start of the competition per USEF rules.
- Scoring is live streamed to FoxVillage.com and the CompetitorTent app. Tests will be available for pick up on table out side of show office.
- Prepackaged snack foods will be available for purchase. Limited hours of availability. Water will be provided through out show.
- Face coverings or masks should be carried by all on show grounds just in case.

BIOSECURITY PROTOCOL:

To mitigate the spread of communicable equine disease, including strains of Equine Herpes Virus, all persons on show grounds must understand and follow basic biosecurity protocols. The complete guidelines will be sent with show information and ride times to all competitors. Competitors, owners, trainers and coaches are responsible to make sure their guests follow guidelines.

For the competitions covered in this prize list the following is required:

- Current vaccination records must be included with entry forms as outlined under #2 page 9.
- Horses **stabled overnight** for the show must have temperature records taken twice per day (AM and PM) for 3 days prior to arrival. Temp record form must be provided at check in. Temps must be taken twice per day while at the facility and posted on the stall door.
- Horse’s showing signs of illness, including fever and nasal discharge, within 72 hours prior to the competition should not be brought to the show grounds.
- Horses that develop signs of illness while at show must be reported to the show office immediately.

SHOW CANCELLATION POLICY:

Please be aware of our show’s good faith cancellation policy.

- Factors outside of show management’s control may cause a show to be interrupted, stopped or cancelled. Factors include, but are not limited to, human communicable disease, equine communicable disease, directive from USEF, or other. If a show must be cancelled in advance due to reasons outside of show management’s control, management will execute a good faith refund policy.
- If show management deems it necessary to cancel a show in advance of the competition, submitted entry fees will be handled as follows:
 - * Organization fees (USEF, USDF and CDFA) - refunded in full
 - * Stabling fees—refunded in full
 - * Class fees may or may not be refunded. Funds from class fees may be retained to cover mandatory costs incurred by the show from officials, staff, and organizational fees/penalties. Show management will endeavor to refund to entrants as much of their show fees as possible.
 - * Office Fees— not refunded.
 - * Fees paid to Fox Village for entry submission service are NOT refundable.
- Yarra Yarra shows are held “rain or shine”. No refunds are given for day of show weather conditions. Weather conditions include, but not limited to; heat, cold, rain, wind, lightning, air quality or other environmental conditions. Conditions may cause interruption or show stoppage due to safety concerns. However, this does not constitute a refund to competitors, as once a competition is underway, all organization fees, officials and others require payment from the show.

It is not the intent of the show to garner profit from cancelled shows. The show will, in good faith, provide refunds for shows cancelled by management in advance of the start of a competition. Situations may arise in which the competitor must make a decision as to if it is in their personal or their horse’s best interest to compete. A competitor is free to choose to scratch when and if they feel they need to. However, when a competitor chooses to scratch or cancel their entry, no refund will be due to the competitor unless the scratch falls under the conditions outlined under #3 of the Show Rules and Information.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. Required Memberships & Information

All YARRA YARRA Dressage shows are recognized by USEF, USDF & CDS.

Every Adult USEF Competing Member listed on show entry **MUST** complete **Safe Sport Training** within 30 days of joining USEF to be eligible for competition. This applies to OWNERS, RIDERS, TRAINERS and COACHES, listed on entry.

Please make sure you renew your memberships at least 7 days prior to starting your entry. If the horse is owned by a Business or Farm, please be sure that the Bus/Farm membership recordings are up to date, as well as one of the Bus/Farm owners. Both sets of membership numbers and cards must be included in the entry.

To participate in the YARRA YARRA shows, the horse **MUST have a USDF & USEF Number**. USEF horse registration must be done on line at the USEF Website prior to entering the show. A USDF Horse Identification Number can be obtained by adding \$35 to your entry where indicated. Rider and Owner on entry must be members of USDF or pay the non-member fee of \$35.

Membership Exceptions: Horses are exempt from USDF and USEF Registration for “Opportunity” and “Introductory” classes. Riders/Owners/Trainers/Coaches are exempt from all membership requirements for “Opportunity” and “Introductory” classes. If you have questions about required memberships, email the show secretary before submitting entry.

Eligibility to ride a USDF Regional Championship Qualifying test requires the following: Rider and Owner are ACTIVE USEF members, Owner is PARTICIPATING and/or BUSINESS member of USDF, Rider is PARTICIPATING Member of USDF, Horse is USDF Lifetime Registered, and USEF Lifetime or Annual Recorded. These memberships must be in place at the time the scores are earned. The \$15 fee for the Qualifying ride must be paid in advance of the ride.

SHOW RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

1. ENTRY ACCEPTANCE:

- All entries must be **received or submitted and paid online** by the closing date listed in the prize list to be considered on time. Show management may close entries early if the show fills prior to closing date. Entries submitted after the show is full will go on the wait list. Competitors will be advised of their entry standing via an entry confirmation sent from **confirmations@foxvillage.com**. Entries submitted that are not accepted will be returned and refunded in full.
- Entries must be filled out completely and have proper fees enclosed. 2024 version of Federation Agreement AND Waiver must be signed by rider, owner, trainer, and if need coach. *Minors (riders under 18 years old) must have the parent or guardian sign the Federation forms. **Missing signature pages, even for online entries, are considered incomplete and charged a \$25 incomplete fee.**
- **COACHES PLEASE NOTE: Coaches must be listed on entry and sign both the Fed Forms. Coach must have active Participating USEF membership. Coach must be present on the show grounds to coach—remote or video coaching is not permitted at this facility.**
- Incorrect, incomplete or entries with bad data may be charged \$25 per correction and/or may not be accepted. This includes missing signature pages.
- Entries submitted without proof of memberships/registrations, are subject to a document service fee of \$25.
- No numbers will be issued without completed entries, full payment, signatures, fees and CURRENT copies of ALL registration cards.
- All entries must include an emergency contact name and number for rider or any other person that will be mounted on show grounds.
- Management reserves the right to accept conditionally or cancel any entries, disqualify riders as exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel or combine classes.
- Online entry available at FoxVillage.com. Late entries accepted **online only** when space allows.

1. ENTRY ACCEPTANCE (continued):

- “Promise-to-Pay” entries not accepted by email, or phone. Late entries must be paid to be accepted.
- Mailed Entries: Make checks payable to YARRA YARRA. Mail entries to: Laurie Daniel 1439 Bismarck Lane, Brentwood, CA 94513
- Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. This show accepts mailed and electronic online entries. Mailed entries are accepted based on the received date, and are only accepted on or after the opening date listed in the prize list. Online entries are accepted based on the date/time stamp of the paid submission. Should the show be over subscribed and the need to cut off entries prior to the closing date arise, entries received after the show fills will be notified and placed on a wait list. Ties regarding entries received at any time on the same day/time will be broken by lot prior to scheduling the show. Affected competitors will be notified and allowed to be present when the drawing of lot is performed. Entries not accepted will be returned and refunded in full.

2. Bio-Security Protocol

- Please note—this show has a BIO-SECURITY PROTOCOL. All Horses **MUST** provide documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhino pneumonitis) vaccinations within six months, and prior to 7 days of competition dates. **Documentation must be submitted with show entry.** Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. See GR845.
- Show management must be notified if any vet is called to show grounds for any reason. Failure to notify show management may result in fine and/or being required to leave competition grounds.
- Show will have an Isolation Protocol in place. Any horse found to present a potential for transmittable disease will be required to follow the Isolation Protocol. Failure to follow Isolation Protocol may be fined and/or required to leave competition grounds.
- Bio-Security protocol does not negate the refund policy as outlined in this prize list.

SHOW RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

3. **SCRATCHES, CHANGES and CANCELLATIONS:** It is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the show secretary (510) 672-3260 of intention to scratch. Refunds are given for scratches **prior to closing date listed on this prize list**, less the \$40.00 office fee. **No refunds** given after closing date w/out vet certificate, **and only if ride can be filled from wait list with same class**, and will also be less the \$40.00 office fee. **Refund of USDF Qualifying Fees:** Scratches prior to show in which a full refund (less office fee) is being made WILL include any USDF Qualifying Fee paid. Scratches that do NOT qualify for a full refund will NOT be refunded any USDF Qualifying Fees. Non-refunded USDF Qualifying Fees will be paid to USDF per USDF requirements. No refund of USDF Qualifying fee for scratches made day of show. **Changes to Entries:** Changes made to entry after submission assessed a \$15 change fee. Changes after the closing date will be assessed a \$20 fee. **Cancellations:** Shows will be held rain or shine. No refunds given due to weather conditions. See page 4 for complete cancellation policy.
4. **REFUNDS:** Refunds are subject to a \$10 processing fee.
5. **ENTRY CONFIRMATIONS:** Entry confirmations will be emailed. Please ensure that your email is set to allow emails from **confirmations@foxvillage.com**. Competitors are responsible for reading and responding to the entry confirmation. If entry confirmation is not received by the closing date of the show, the competitor is advised to contact the show secretary.
6. **RIDE TIMES:** Times will be emailed and posted to Fox Village website (www.foxvillage.com), and posted on show grounds in a conspicuous place by noon the day prior to the start of the show and cannot change after that, except in compliance with GR830.5 It is the rider's responsibility to inform management if times are not received. Please do not assume lower levels will be run first, as may be necessary to run classes out of order of difficulty. Due to weather and other factors, upper levels may be scheduled earlier in the day than lower levels.
7. **MANAGEMENT:** The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision will be final. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and to cancel /award prizes, without claim to damage, to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or substitute officials. The judges decisions are strictly their own and the Management accepts absolutely no responsibility for those decisions. Management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges and to cancel, combine or amend any class, including but not limited to class awards, scheduling and location.
8. **WARM UP RINGS:** NO ONE allowed on foot in the warm up arenas. Coaches must be outside the arena at all times.
9. **NON-COMPETE HORSES:** Horses not competing in the show must be registered with the show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times when out of the stall or away from trailer. Entry form and signed Federation Agreement & Waiver must be submitted, and appropriate fees must be paid prior to the horse being ridden. Failure to register and pay for schooling horse can result in doubling of entry fee. Non-compete horses are allowed in the warm-up as long as there is room and their presence is not disruptive. This determination will be made solely at the discretion of show management. There may be other areas on the grounds available for schooling purposes. No schooling of horses in or around competition arenas during the competition. After the completion of the competition, with permission of show management, competition arenas may be opened for schooling. Due to limited stabling, companion/non-compete horses may be restricted.
10. **PONY MEASUREMENT CARDS:** Competitors wishing to have their scores count for pony awards must indicate that the pony has a measurement card on their entry. If the competitor wants to have their pony measured by the TD at the show, they must let show secretary know two weeks in advance of show date. Management advises that if the on-call vet feels it is necessary to travel to a sick or injured horse instead of coming to the show to measure, the show will in no way be held responsible or liable for this decision on the part of the vet. Management will arrange for a measuring stick to be available. Competitor will be responsible for all vet charges, and any charges incurred for rental of a measuring stick if required. Please call show secretary 2 weeks in advance if you need to arrange for pony measurement.
11. **FREESTYLES:** Freestyle music must be on **compact disk**. Please give to Show Secretary upon check-in on show day. Sound check will be held daily at the first break.
12. **STABLING:** Limited, permanent 12 x12 stalls with doors available. Weekend rates, no day stalls. Stalls are pre-bedded. No additional shavings or feed available on the grounds. Stabling must be indicated on show entry and paid with entry fees. Please indicate ONE group name on your entry if in a stabling group. (Barn name works well.) Stabling is limited, recommend early entry if stabling is needed. Please indicate on entry time of arrival. If arriving after 6:00 PM the night prior to the show, please call the show secretary to arrange arrival. Yarra Yarra is a private barn and needs notice for late arrivals.
13. **RV PARKING:** Limited RV spaces available. \$35 per night. Must be self contained—electrical only, no water hook ups.

14. **AWARDS:** Ribbons through 5th place.
15. **FOOD:** Food available on the grounds.
16. **LUNGING:** Absolutely no lunging in the warm up arena. Lunging allowed in designated lunging arenas only.
17. **ARENAS and FOOTING:** Show arena(s) are outdoors and are standard regulation size (20m x 60m) overall dimensions approx. 100' x 240', and has sand/rubber footing mix. Warm up arena is inside and outside with similar footing. Lunge ring available.
18. **VET & FARRIER:** On call. Phone numbers will be posted at the show office.
19. **EMT:** Qualified medical personnel are on the premises at all horse shows.
20. **DOGS:** Preferable that dogs stay at home, any dog on the property must be on leash at all times, and not allowed in indoor arena or near competition arenas. Please review USEF Rules GR1301.6.
21. **DIRECTIONS:** From HWY 680, take 580 East. Exit Tassajara. Go North on Tassajara and turn left into Yarra Yarra at the first entry gate. Press red button to open gate.
22. **ACCOMMODATIONS:** Many hotels in the Dublin/Pleasanton area. Show does not have a specific show hotel.

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

RULES:

SHARPS CONTAINERS: GR1210.4 Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. **Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.** Competition management will place a notice of this requirement either in its prize list or on a specific handout given to trainers on check in at the competition. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail. Competitions failing to comply with placing the required number of containers on the show grounds will be considered in violation of the rules and may be subject to penalty as determined by the CEO or Executive Director and/or the Hearing Committee.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (2024)

MORE RULES:

DR120 Dress:

WAIVING OF COATS: In locations with high average heat and humidity on the date of a competition, management can publish in their prize list that jackets will be waived for the duration of the competition. Alternatively, management can announce prior to or during a competition that competitors can show without jackets when extreme heat and/or humidity is forecast. This waiver applies to in all classes including FEI classes at National Competitions. However, competitors must wear protective headgear and a shirt with sleeves and collar, without neckwear, and without decoration except as described under .14 of the rule. T-shirts are not permitted. Members of the Armed Services or police units may wear summer uniforms. *(NOTE: For the Yarra Yarra show series Coats will be waived based on weather conditions and will be posted and announced at the show.)*

HELMET RULE EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2013: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse a any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat covers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120 (see GR801).

Safe Sport Training Requirements

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

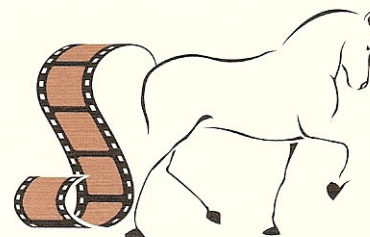
While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:
